



17th ZEMOS98 FESTIVAL CARING FOR THE CITY: RECLAIM THE COMMONS



Four years have passed since the protest wave of 2011 captivated Europe. Far from subsiding, neoliberal policies continue to be imposed, threatening what we consider to be a desirable life. Inequality grows exponentially, as new enclosures proliferate beyond the realm of material resources and into that of basic needs and human rights, like housing, health care, culture and education. Faced with this dismantling of the lives we have in common, we have no choice but to ask ourselves: who decides how our lives must be?

The 17th and final edition of the ZEMOS98 Festival will reflect on the work and the proposals that the social agents and movements that emerged from the citizen uprisings of 2011 are carrying out in the area of the commons, the social and solidarity economy and the defense of public space.



#RECLAIMTHECOMMONS HACKCAMP

#reclaimthecommons is a three day hackcamp that brings together different artists, mediamakers, activists and thinkers who are working in the fields of the commons, alternative and socially engaged economies and the demand for public spaces as common goods. The aim is to produce several results after a collective reflection on the challenges and possibilities of these demands.

The hackcamp is an activity that includes over 50 guests from all over Europe. Thee results will be presented on Saturday, April 18th from 17:00 to 18:30 during a CopyParty held at the Centro de las Artes de Sevilla (CAS).


